Billig, a co-owner of the Spokane Indians Baseball Club, was elected to the Washington State House of Representatives in his first run for public office in 2010. In his first term, Billig compiled an impressive legislative record. The following are a few of his legislative accomplishments:

Billig is an active member of the Spokane community. He has served previously on the board of directors for the Spokane area YMCA and as a member of the City of Spokane Human Services Advisory Board. He has also been a volunteer Big Brother and youth sports coach. He is currently a board member for Innovate Washington.

Billig is a graduate of Georgetown University where he earned a degree in government. He lives with his daughter who is a 6^{th} grader in the Spokane Public Schools.
